Banner Exhibits

Judging: Thursday, July 6th, 2017 1p.m.

Guidelines for using copy righted/trademark materials in banners, displays, & posters.

4-H exhibitors (individual or group) should avoid using copyrighted and/or trademarked materials by originating his/her own work (not even 'Uncle Sam' or any similar reference may be used) Copyrighted and/or trademarked materials used in banners, displays, demonstrations, posters, or other activities for endorsement or promotion instead of educational purposes will be disqualified, and will not be displayed or be eligible for ribbon or premium.

1. Awards on banner exhibits will be based on educational value, 40 percent; interest and originality, 20 percent; general appearance and attractiveness, 20 percent; quality of display materials, 20 percent.
2. Each 4-H club may exhibit one banner. 'All Exhibits must be entered by 11a.m.'
3. Exhibits removed without permission will not be eligible for prize money.
4. All entries must provide a label giving the club name, county, and year to the superintendent at the time of entry to be attached after judging. Waterproof ink is recommended.
5. Banners are a two-dimensional display depicting one idea. Banners should be made of flame-retardant material. Dimensions are to be no less than 12 and no more than 16 square feet with no side less than three feet. Banners will be measured. Those failing to meet size requirements will be penalized one ribbon placing. Banners must be hung on a rod strong enough to support the banner. On each end of the rod, there must be a wire or chain 6 inches long. One end of the wire or chain is to be fastened to the end of the rod. The other end should be connected to an "S" hook which will permit the banner to be hung for display. Banners should be made of materials that permit the banner to be folded or rolled without damaging a display. Do not attach 3 dimensional objects to the front of the banner.
6. Each banner should illustrate a demonstrate a phase of 4-H work being practiced by the club members within the club entering the exhibit. General 4-H information banners are also acceptable.

7. Banners will be placed in Purple, Blue, Red, & White ribbon groups. A champion and reserve champion may be placed at the discretion of the judge.
8. Clubs are encouraged to have a representative present during judging, so that entry placing may be discussed after judging.
