BEEF

Special Rules

1. Read general Rules
2. All calves entered in the market beef division must be stalled together in the livestock barn in the place designated. Straw will be furnished by the owner.
3. Only first and second blue winners in each class are eligible to compete for breed champion.
4. All beef exhibits must be in place at 11 am Thursday.
5. In the breeding heifer classes, each exhibitor must present proof of ownership and registration of his/her animal or animals as of May 1 of current year upon request.
6. Classes will be divided by weight. All entries must be weighed-in prior to entry deadline 11am Thursday.
7. Champion ribbons are awarded only if animals entered are considered championship quality by the judge.
8. In individual breed classes (market or breeding), three entries are required to form a separate class. If there are not three animals entered, those animals will be judged in the same class with the crossbred or other breeds animals.
9. Heifers can be shown in market or breeding classes, but not both
10. All animals must be kept under control by the exhibitor or be removed from the fair grounds.

Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Market Steers and Heifers

Open to first and second blue winners in preceding market steer and heifer classes. A trophy will be presented to the grand champion market beef.

Special Market Beef Group Class

Each Club may enter groups of three market beefs, from the regular market beef show, in the group class. The Beef must be fitted and exhibited by club member owners; a fourth member from the competing club may assist in handling the animals in the the ring. Clubs may enter as many groups of three market beefs as they have entered in the fair. The top three entries will receive club awards of \$10 for first place, \$7.50 for second place and \$5 for third place.

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Breeding Beef

Class 40 ____ Heifer Calves born after Sept 1, 2016

Class 41 ____ Heifer Summer Yearling born May 1 2016 to Aug 31, 2016

Class 42 ____ Heifer Junior Yearling born Jan 1, 2016 to April 20, 2016

Class 43 – Other Heifers and cows born prior to Jan 1, 2016

Note: Breed Classifications will follow the guidelines and rules of Kansas State Fair/Youth Division.

Breeding Beef Champions

Open to the first and second blue winners in individual breed classes. Rosettes may be awarded to the champion and reserve champion Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, Simmental and Crossbreed. Champion rosettes are awarded only if animals entered are considered championship quality by the judge.

Supreme Female Award

The Champion female of each breed will compete for an overall female trophy.

Fitting and Showing

See complete rules listed under Division C.

Fitting and showing classes will be offered before or after other classes at the discretion of the judge.

Junior division – Exhibitors 7-9 years of age as of Jan 1 of the current year.

Intermediate division – Exhibitors 10-13 years of age as of Jan 1 of the current year.

Senior division – Exhibitors 14 years of age or older as of Jan 1 of the current year.

Participants awarded ribbons only, no premiums

The overall showman champion will be presented a trophy.

Top two compete in Round Robin Showmanship Contest.
