Special Rules

1. Read General Rules
2. Entries are made on regular entry cards
3. Horses check-in begins at 8:30am Thursday and will be released after showing at 9am
4. Current 4-H Horse I.D. required upon request.
5. Riding horses shown in this contest may be owned or leased by the 4-H member or his/her family and must have been managed by the 4-H'er at least 75 percent of the time from May 1 to Sept 30 of the current year.
6. Exhibitors must follow state 4-H dress code.
7. Reining classes must follow one of the approved 4-H reining patterns.
8. A horse or pony may be shown by two family members that have completed an identification certificate for the same horse or pony. However, no horse or pony may be entered and shown twice in one class.
9. Superintendent will decide if junior, intermediate and senior classes are necessary.
10. Classes may be divided into mares and geldings at superintendent's discretion.
11. The superintendent may divide Other Breeds classes into specific breed classes if numbers are justified. A minimum of three entries of one breed are required to form a separate class.
12. Proof of Coggins test within 12 months is require upon request.
13. 4-H horse rules from the current Kansas 4-H Horse Show Rule Book will be followed, with the exception of rules stated in the Tri-County Free Fair paper.
