Shop Skills

Judging: Refer To The Schedule In Fair Paper

1. Read general rules. 'All exhibits must be entered by 11:00 a.m.'
2. Entries must be made and complete at the time of Thursday 11:00a.m.
3. Entries located on the concrete slab located at the west end of the Poultry/Rabbit Barn. Check with Division Superintendent prior to unloading.
4. Displays in this department will consist basically of examples of labor saving devices and/or examples of farm machinery and equipment which has been constructed, repaired, reconditioned, or renovated. The work on this display must have been done by the high school students in the agriculture education shop, being constructed in the last two years prior to the Fair. If exhibit has been awarded a premium at the Tri-County Free Fair in the previous year, it will be ineligible to compete for prizes.
5. All exhibits must be clean and in a presentable condition for show purposes.
6. Displays from FFA or 4-H club competing for group awards will consist of 4 pieces of equipment or machinery, one of which may be a repair job. The entries will be judged collectively, one group against another for prizes. Entries in the group display must be designate at the time of entry. Any premium or prize awarded in the group display will be awarded to the FFA Chapter or 4-H Club.
7. Pieces of equipment of machinery entered as part of the group display many be entered in the individual class, but an entry card must be made out for each piece.
8. Individual entries may exhibit a range of skills including welding, forging, concrete work, woodworking, etc.
9. Exhibitors should make entries on county-designated entry cards available at the Fair Office or from the Division Superintendent on the day entries are placed.
10. Formally open only to FFA members this division is now open to 4-H members.
